FACTS ABOUT FLOODING

CHILD DISASTER RELIEF

Often words are used to describe the type of flooding and associated weather conditions. Below is a glossary that can help to explain these words to children.

TYPES OF FLOODING & ALERTS

What does it mean when there is a *flood watch?*

- A flood watch is when the weather indicates the possibility of flooding.

What does it mean when there is a *flash flood warning?*

 A flash flood warning is given when water is expected to flood very quickly, usually between 3-6 hours.

What does it mean when there is a *flood warning*?

- A flood warning is issued when flooding is about to happen or is already occurring.

What does it mean when there is a *flood advisory*?

 A flood advisory is issued when flooding may cause inconvenience. It's important to use caution if travelling.

LEVELS OF FLOODING

- Minor: Minor means little or not very much damage to homes, roads or the community. It might be a little harder to get around.
- Moderate: Some flooding of homes and communities or roads. People in low-lying areas or near bodies of water may need to evacuate to a safe shelter.
- Major: Major is when there is A LOT of water. Water enters buildings and floods roads throughout the community making it very dangerous. Entire communities of people and animals will need to evacuate to a safe shelter.
